

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Safety instructions

Perfect technology: Prerequisite for your safety
High-quality materials and excellent workmanship
ensure that Porsche Classic Communication
Management has a long service life.
Porsche Classic Communication Management
needs your attention and care to fulfil its potential.
This will ensure that Porsche Classic
Communication Management can be relied upon
even in critical situations.

Porsche Classic Communication Management is the central control unit for the radio, media functions, Phone, navigation, sound settings and Car.

The following points must be observed to ensure that you do not endanger or harm yourself or others when using Porsche Classic Communication Management:

▲ WARNUNG

Risk of accident

Any distraction may cause control of the vehicle to be lost.

Only operate Porsche Classic Communication
 Management when the vehicle is safely under
 control and the traffic situation permits. If in
 doubt, stop the vehicle and operate Porsche
 Classic Communication whilst stationary.

MARNUNG

Risk of accident

The navigation system only provides the driver with support and suggests a route.

This does not release the driver from the full responsibility for correct driving style and behaviour in road traffic in accordance with the rules of the German Road Traffic Regulations (StVO) and other relevant regulations. The driver is responsible for assessing the traffic situation. The driver retains sole responsibility for driving the vehicle safely.

► Remain aware of the traffic situation.

▲ WARNUNG

Risk of injury

Do not use the telephone close to explosive substances (e.g. at a petrol station) or close to explosives.

In certain hazardous areas, such as close to petrol stations, fuel depots, chemical plants and blasting operations, mobile phones must be switched off.

The Porsche Classic Communication Management

contains high-quality electronic components whose maintenance and care requires special attention.

The following points should be noted:

- The screen is susceptible to scratches.
- The device must not be splashed with liquids. The ingress of liquids may destroy the device.
- Clean your Porsche Classic Communication Management carefully from time to time with a dry, clean and soft cloth (microfibre cloth) or a cleaning brush.
- Do not exert excessive pressure on the surface when cleaning.
- Never use solvents such as methylated spirits, thinners, petrol, acetone or alcohol (ethanol, methanol or isopropyl alcohol) or abrasives.
- Remove fingerprints with a damp cloth or mild detergent.
- Never spray detergents or other liquids directly onto the screen. Instead, moisten a cloth and gently wipe the screen.
- In the event of a malfunction never open the Porsche Classic Communication Management device yourself! In the event of a fault have the device repaired at a qualified specialist workshop.

We recommend that a Porsche Partner is used for this work as they have trained workshop personnel and the necessary parts and tools.



E--TUNER button

Use the TUNER to access the radio mode and change between FM/AM/DAB+ $\,$

G--Skip left Button

- ◆ Radio status The previous channel on the radio
- ◆ Music status previous song

I--CAR Button

Use the CAR button to enter the Trip interface

K--BACK button

Use the BACK button to return to the previous menu step

Controls and their functions

A--Microphone

The built-in microphone is used to make a telephone call with the Bluetooth hands-free kit.

B--Sensor for switching between day/night settings

The day/night sensor enables the device to detect the current ambient lighting level and adjust the display brightness accordingly

C--Left knob Button

- ◆ Turn the left knob ---> to adjust the volume
- ◆ Short press the left knob ---> to activate or deactivate the mute function
- ◆ Long press the left knob ---> Quickly power off, then short press to power on and memorize the radio broadcast

D--HOME button and Voice recognition Button

- ◆ Short press the HOME button to enter the navigation main menu and access the following functions:
- Tuner, media, phone, navigation, map, sound, settings, application

 ◆ Long press HOME button to wake up Apple CarPlay/Android Auto voice
- F--PHONE button

Use the PHONE button to switch to Bluetooth hands-free mode

H--Skip right Button

- ◆ Radio status Next channel on the radio
- ◆ Music status Next song

J--NAV Button

Use the NAV button to switch to the GPS navigation mode. Further information navigating with the device can be found in the separate Navigation Manual

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L--Besides the touchscreen the right-hand knob is the central control element

Turn the knob to select APP, track, radio and other functions forward or backward. After selecting APP, track, radio function item, vertical short press is to confirm the selection.

M--Navigation software card slot

Navigation software card slot holds the MicroSDHC navigation software and map material card

N--Media card slot

Play media music, fast charge, Carplay/Android Auto

O--Touchscreen display

In addition to the right-hand knob the touchscreen is also a central control element. Any menu item can be selected directly from the touchscreen display.

Press the Settings [] button to switch to general device settings mode.



Basic functions

Communication Management on and off

Switching on/off via the ignition

► Switch on the ignition. Porsche Classic Communication Management is active.

Switching on/off via the left-hand knob

If you do not wish the Porsche Classic Communication Management to be permanently active, you can also switch it on/ff using the left-hand knob.

► Press the left knob for at least one second.

Adjusting the volume

Turn the left knob. Depending on situation, you can change the volume as follows:

- -- the active audio source,
- -- a traffic announcement,
- -- an announcement by the navigation,
- -- the telephone ringing tone during an incoming call,
- -- making a hands free telephone call.

Mute/Cancel muting

- Briefly press the left knob. The active audio source is muted
- ▶ To cancel muting briefly press or turn the left knob.



Information

Muting is also used to cancel incoming traffic announcements (TA)

Selecting the operating mode

The various Porsche Classic Communication Management modes are selected by pressing the HOME; TUNER; MEDIA; PHONE and NAV buttons.

Menu types and operation options

The Porsche Classic Communication Management screen is a colour touch screen. All of the menu functions, list entries and input menus, as well as the arrow symbols and scroll bars are operated by lightly touching the respective part of the screen.

Which menus are available?

The HOME Menu

The functional range of Porsche Classic Communication Management is divided into the following main menus via the HOME menu:

- --TUNER (button in the HOME menu or the button): Radio main menu,
- $--\mbox{MEDIA}$ (button in the HOME menu or the button): Media main menu,
- --PHONE (button in the HOME menu or the button): Telephone, main menu
- --NAV (button in the HOME menu or the button): Navigation main menu,
- --Map (button in the HOME menu): map view
- --Sound (button in the HOME menu): Sound settings,
- $\operatorname{\mathsf{--Car}}(\operatorname{\mathsf{button}}\operatorname{\mathsf{in}}\operatorname{\mathsf{the}}\operatorname{\mathsf{HOME}}\operatorname{\mathsf{menu}})$: General device settings,
- --App (button in the HOME menu): Android-Auto® or AppleCarplay® mode.

In many of these main menus various sub menus are combined to form a single topic.

Jump back to the HOME menu

► Press the [HOME] key to return to the HOME Menu.

Options menus

There is an options menu [**Options**] for some of the main menus where you will find setting options and further functions for that particular main menu.

Calling up and operating menu types Call up main menus

To call up a main menu, press the corresponding key on the Porsche Classic Communication Management or select the corresponding button via the menu [HOME] on the touchscreen. You can change from one main menu to another menu at any time. To return to the top level of a main menu, use the [BACK] button until you return to the top level of the main menu.

Call up options menus

► To access an Options menu, select the [Options] button in the main menu on the touch screen.

Operating menus with the touchscreen

► Touch the individual menu items or buttons directly on the screen.

Operating menus with the right-hand knob

As an alternative to operating via the touch screen operation, the menu items can also be operated using the right-hand knob

► Highlight a menu item by turning the right-hand knob

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► Select the highlighted menu item by pressing the right-hand knob

Exit menus

Jump back to the next higher menu

Press the [BACK] button to cancel an operation and go to the next higher menu

Jump back to main menu

Press a main menu button to return to the corresponding main menu.

Return to the top level of a main menu

Press the [BACK] button several times to reach the top level of the main menu. Alternatively, press the corresponding key on the Porsche Classic Communication Management or select the corresponding button in the menu [HOME] via the touchscreen.

Operating lists

The following options are available for highlighting a menu item:

- ► Turning the right knob A highlighted menu item is indicated by an orange frame.
- ► Press the right-hand knob - or -
- ► Select a menu entry via the touchscreen: Confirm the selection.

Operating the input menus

In some cases data can be entered into Porsche Classic Communication Management. For example, when entering a telephone number.

► To enter data in an input menu touch the characters on the screen.

- Mark the characters by turning the right-hand knob and select them by pressing the righthand knob
- To confirm and accept the data entered so far, select the corresponding button, e.g. in the menu.

The input menus include some buttons in addition to numbers.

- deletes the last entry in the input field.
- 123& switches to digits and special characters
- #+= switches to extended special characters
- ABC switches to letters/switches to Cyrillic alphabet (only if Russian is selected as menu language)
- switches between upper and lower case letters
- inserts blanks
- OK confirms the entry and searches for entries in the phone book
- dials the entered phone number ends the current call
- ★ # is used to enter GSM service codes
- + is used to enter country codes
- is used to change values

Option fields

Some menu items have fields known as option fields for selecting different options.

Sound settings Sound

The sound settings in the [Sound] menu are used to set the sound of your Porsche Classic Communication Management for the audio sources as follows:

Equalizer Settings

- 1. Press [Sound] button.
- 2. Select menu item [Equalizer].
- 3. Touch [+ land [lor turn the knob on the right to select the desired setting:
 - --Bass adjustment range: -5~+5;
 - --Treble adjustment range: -5~+5

Switch Loudness on/off

As the human ear is most sensitive at medium frequencies it makes sense to use this function at low volume where the system increases high and low frequencies this results in better audibility.

- 1. Press [Sound] button.
- 2. Check box [Loudness] activate or deactivate.

Set Fader

The fader setting is used to adjust the volume level distribution between the rear and front speakers.

- 1. Press [Sound] button.
- 2. Select menuitem [Fader].

3. Touch [+]and [-]or turn the knob on the right to select the desired setting.

Adjust Balance

The balance setting is used to adjust the volume level distribution between the le± and right speakers.

- 1. Press [Sound] button.
- 2. Select menu item [Balance].
- 3. Touch [+] and [-] or turn the knob on the right to select the desired setting.

1. Press [Sound] button.

- 2. Select menuitem [Reset sound settings].
- 3. Select the [Reset] button.

Information

To adjust the volume of different audio sources separately (for example navigation, radio or Media), select the menu item Volume in the Settings menu.

Speed dependent volume

- 1. Press [Sound] button.
- 2. Select menu item [Speed dependent volume].
- 3. Touch [+] and [-] or turn the knob on the right to select the desired setting.

Audio Pilot

- 1. Press [Sound] button.
- 2. Check box [Audio Pilot] activate or deactivate.

Reset sound settings

Reset sound settings is used to delete all sound settings and reset them to default values.

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

- X The station buttons on the fourth page are automatically assigned the 5 strongest radio stations.




Fig.: Media source e.g. USB

- 5. Some applications require a valid data connection and may incur additional charges, depending on the phone tariff.

Operate Apple CarPlay via Siri speech recognition


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Fig.: Phone manager
